## A/Prof. Huia Tomlins-Jahnke

**Primary Education** 

Place based iwi education immerses students in local heritage, culture, landscapes, opportunities and experiences. While place based iwi education is the norm for children in kura kaupapa and other Māori medium contexts, for the majority of Māori children who are located in mainstream schools there remains a disjunction between the school habitus (including the curriculum) and their everyday lives and experiences. This seminar examines the impulse behind place based iwi education initiatives, the outcomes of recent research carried out by one iwi and the implications for teacher education.

Huia Tomlins-Jahnke of Ngāti Kahungunu, Ngāti Toa Rangatira, Ngai Tahu and Ngāti Hine, is an Associate Professor and Head of School at Te Uru Māraurau, Massey University. Her expertise is in Māori Development; Māori and Indigenous Education; Māori and Indigenous Research Methods and Ethics of Knowledge Production.
