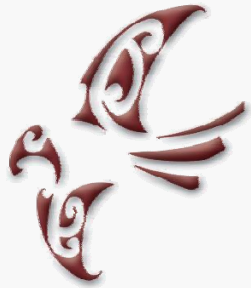

What will Aotearoa look like in 2035?



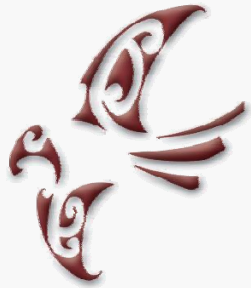
- Recognize and value peace, shelter, food, income, sustainable resources, jobs, social justice and equity
